Public Misconceptions and Stereotypes. Are They Hindering Conservation Efforts?

The images featured on this poster clearly show the perception of whales by the general public, as well as how outreach education efforts can change that perception.

In May 2018, members of the NARWC Education Committee were invited to participate in the 2018 Volvo Ocean Race Stopover to promote the *Sharing the Seas: Safe Boating for Sailors and Whales* program. The Volvo Events Committee provided a graphic designer to developed an outreach banner for each organization hosting a booth at the Stopover event.

Although NARWC Education Committee members provided information and NARW images to the Volvo staff, the first banner featured a cartoon image of a whale. This demonstrated a lack of understanding of whales and the seriousness of the topic.

Several revisions, based on guidance from members of the Education Committee, were necessary to create a poster that was both accurate and on point. One intermediate version featured a bowhead whale rather than a NARW.
